



SHIPPING CONTAINER DELIVERY GUIDELINES

Please review these requirements before ordering. A prepared site helps protect you, your property, the container, and the delivery equipment.

These measurements are minimums, and all turns, slopes, nearby structures, and obstacles must be considered.
(We do not drive through ditches, bushes, or low tree branches, and we will not make any approach that risks damage to our equipment or the container. We do not deliver on steep inclines or declines; the placement area must be reasonably level.)

DELIVERY – WHAT TO EXPECT

WE CONFIRM THE DETAILS.

A few days before delivery, we will confirm the contact information, address, door direction (loaded facing the truck or facing to the rear), delivery timeframe, site readiness, potential weather concerns, and any special instructions.

THE DRIVER WILL BE IN CONTACT.

After the container is loaded and the driver is leaving the depot, they will contact you with an estimated arrival time.

DELIVERY EQUIPMENT MAY VARY.

Containers are normally delivered on a tilt-bed trailer, or by rollback tow truck for some 20-foot deliveries, depending on available space.

PLEASE BE READY WHEN THE DRIVER ARRIVES.

Unloading typically will take about 20–30 minutes when the site is prepared. If the driver must wait more than 30 minutes before the delivery can be done, wait-time charges may apply. We want to make sure your delivery is done correctly and safely, but also done in a reasonable amount of time.
